**Writing Assignment:** You will write a **FOUR-paragraph** essay using the guidelines listed below. This must be **TYPED** using the **MLA format** and must include a **WORK CITED** page.

**Paragraph 1:** Discuss who your favorite character was in the novel and explain why. Provide one piece of textual evidence (a direct quotation from the novel) along with the proper in-text citation.

**Paragraph 2:** Explain the parts of the story that you liked and disliked. Provide one piece of textual evidence (a direct quotation from the novel) along with the proper in-text citation.

**Paragraph 3:** Examine a theme of the novel OR a lesson learned from the novel. Provide one piece of textual evidence (a direct quotation from the novel) along with the proper in-text citation.

**Paragraph 4:** Explain the way the title fits the story. Provide one piece of textual evidence (a direct quotation from the novel) along with the proper in-text citation.

**\*In-text citation** - (author's last name and page number)

**Example** - (Dumas 72)

**Rubric:**

**Grammar - 15 points** - Be sure to use proper punctuation and capitalization. Avoid run-ons, fragments, and spelling errors.

**MLA format - 10 points** - This includes the proper heading, title, and page numbers. Use Times New Roman, size 12.

**Work Cited page - 10 points** - Use the Easy Bib add-on to complete your Work Cited page.

**Discussion in paragraphs - 65 points** - Be sure to include a direct quotation with in-text citation in each paragraph.
